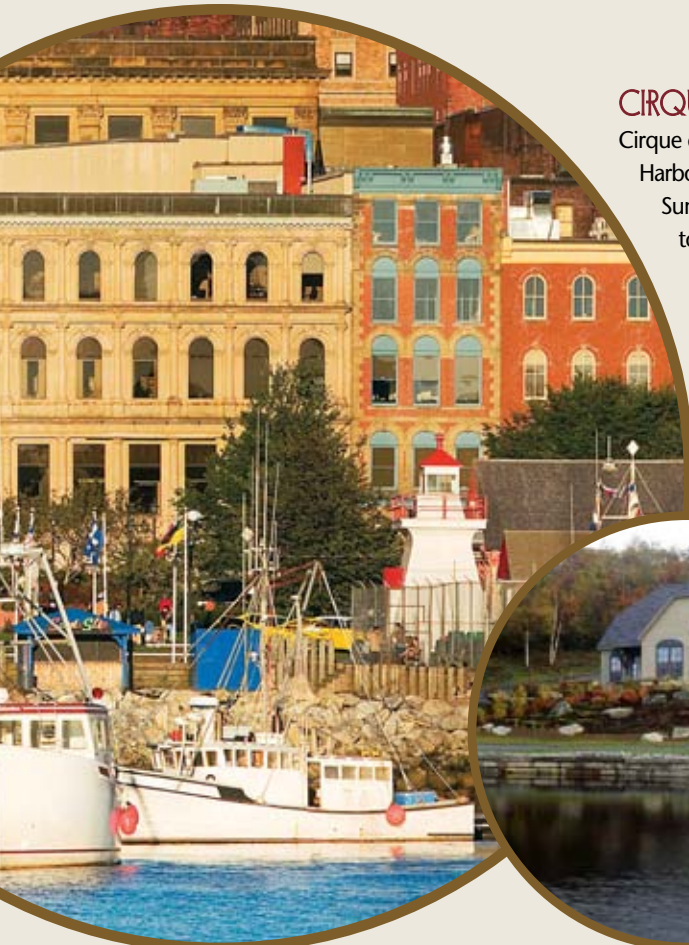

Rockwood Park Additions Continue to Enhance Urban Gem

Located only five minutes from the city centre, Rockwood Park can now boast its year round availability as an outdoor recreation area featuring swimming, boating, biking, geocaching, rollerblading in the summer, Nordic walking, hiking, rock climbing and repelling in the fall and spring and skating, cross country skiing, sleigh rides and snow shoeing in the winter. A new improved trail and boardwalk encircling Lily Lake provides a spectacular vista worth bragging about. Visitors to Rockwood Park can now enjoy a leisurely stroll around the lake with much easier access.



When park goes need to rest, they can now enjoy a comfortable licensed cafe sitting on the water's edge in the lower level of the Pavilion. Lily's Café features a floor to ceiling stone fireplace and comfortable lodge like seating. Connected to the cafe is an ice cream parlour called the Lily Pad which features contributions by local artist Constance Wooldridge Vincent. The Three Sisters Lamp Now Resides in Picturesque St. Patrick's Park

St. Patrick's Park has undergone a considerable refurbishment, from the non-descript patch of land at the end of Prince William Street to a lovely park overlooking the cruise passengers' entryway to our city. The earliest light at the present location of the "Three Sisters" was a single oil lamp erected in 1842. It was placed in direct line with the steeple of Trinity Church so that harbour pilots and sea captains were able to navigate their way safely into the harbour at night. In 1849, it was replaced by three red gas lamps visible for three miles seaward. The official dedication of the park takes place on March 17th, St. Patrick's Day in Canada's most Irish City.

Barbour's General Store Museum Gets New Home Next to Famous Sculptures

Saint Andrew's Park, located directly across from City Hall at the foot of King Street has been recently redeveloped. The entrance will feature the relocated Barbour's General Store, an authentic nineteenth-century country store featuring over 2,000 artifacts. The store is a popular stop for visitors and cruise passengers seeking information on the city. The park will also feature John Hooper's famous sculpture *People Waiting*.

Reversing Falls New Lookout Sees Two Worlds Collide

Reversing Falls has a new lookout for visitors to witness the amazing phenomenon. The lookout includes a magnificent view of the world famous Reversing Falls, access ramp and stairs, connecting walkways, lighting, landscaping, and interpretation panels at the eastern end of the Reversing Falls Bridge. In addition to the view of the magnificent rapids, visitors can see evidence of the continental drift at the formation of what is referred to as Split Rock, below the Reversing Falls Restaurant. The area is a unique geological area where continents collided and scientists have discovered rock formations sandwiched together that at one time in the distant past were in Antarctica and Africa.



Skateboard Enthusiasts Claim New Park is 'Fly'

The uptown skate plaza is 15,000 sq feet, and is located under the viaduct between Harbour Passage and Harbour Station. Designed to be the best in Atlantic Canada, the park echoes the lines of Saint John's architecture and gives skateboarders a place on the waterfront. The park is in heavy use and expected to draw visitors from across eastern Canada.
